Month in Review

Equity markets rose in September. World equities rose by 3.2% in euro terms. Emerging Markets was the strongest performer – followed by Japan and Asia Pacific ex Japan. Small Cap and Europe were the weakest performers. IT, Consumer Discretionary and Communication Services were the strongest sectors. Consumer Staples, Energy and REITs were the weakest. Euro area bond markets rose by 0.4%.

Equity markets were boosted by a US rate cut and also by the signalling from the Fed of further rate cuts in 2025, as economic data, particularly regarding employment, continued to cool. Euro bond markets were boosted as inflation remained stable at the ECB's target rate of 2%.

Wolters Kluwer, Norfolk Southern and iShares S&P 500 Information Technology Sector UCITS ETF were the best performers. S&P Global, Ashtead and London Stock Exchange were the weakest performers. Within fixed income, Amundi Prime Euro Government Bond UCITS ETF was the best performer and Xtrackers Germany Government Bond UCITS ETF was the worst performer.
